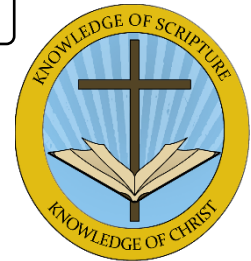

This week we begin the Season of Lent. **ASH WEDNESDAY (6th of March)** is a day of Fasting and Abstinence. All the three Holy Masses scheduled on that day (**7am, 9am & 7pm**) will include the Rite of Ashes, which is a symbol of Repentance, Conversion and Spiritual Renewal.

Please take into account that the 9am Holy Mass will be attended by the whole St Jerome's Primary School. There will be a single collection at the 7am and 7pm masses to support the poor.



THE ROSARY (IN HONOUR OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES AND ST. BERNADETTE) will be recited in the Chapel on each of the following apparition dates:

Monday the 4th of March at 6:30pm

On Wednesday, the 13th of March we will have **Lenten Reflections at 7pm** and this will continue each **Wednesday** of Lent.

On Friday, the 8th of March, we will have the **Stations of the Cross at 7pm**. The Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday evening followed by Mass during Lent, until the solemn VIA CRUCIS around the church on Good Friday morning.
