Father's Reflection

In these weeks of Easter, we've been hearing the stories of Jesus' resurrection appearances: the empty tomb; Jesus appearing to the disciples in the Locked room; the road to Emmaus; and now Jesus gives us an image of the Shepherd and the sheep. The instructions for Christian life are quite simple. There is no need to go searching for advice: suffice it follow a voice, as sheep do with their shepherd.

Today the Gospel gives us a rare image that we talk about or talk about as much, that of Jesus being a gate: "I am the gate of the sheepfold." There are three key words in today's gospel. First key word; Jesus is the Gate, the door through which the sheep have an access to the shepherd. Thus, it is all very clear: One cannot enter into eternal life through another way that is not the door, that is, which is not Jesus. The Lord is the door of our life — and not only of eternal life but also of our daily life. One who does not use the proper door is a thief and bandit or in simple words 'smuggler' one can take it by "smuggling". But the Lord speaks clearly; the sheepfold is entered "only through the door, which is Jesus".

The second key word: "the way: following Jesus". The instruction of Jesus is clear: "Do not go astray!" It is Jesus "who is the door through which we enter and through which we exit with him to follow the way of life". It is Jesus who shows us the way. Thus, those who follow Jesus do not go astray. The direction is clear, but there are many occasions to go astray due to the fact that we listen to the different voices that are loud spoken in this world to make us to choose different path. If you do this, you aren't following Jesus! You are following someone else, who gives you another, different way, because "there is no one else who can point the way". If we follow him, we are not mistaken.

Finally, the third key: "voice". The sheep follow Jesus "because they know his voice". Someone might ask: "Father, how can I recognize Jesus' voice? And also protect myself from the voice of those who are not Jesus, who come in through the window, who are robbers, who destroy, who deceive?". First of all, tune my heart and mind to his voice- FAITH. Secondly the voice of Jesus is found in the Scriptures. I need to take the Scripture into my hands and read it. Thirdly, the relationship with Jesus has to grow stronger through my prayer and spiritual exercises. Finally seek the guidance of the faith experience people, parents, grandparents and spiritual mentors.

Jesus is obviously our Good Shepherd, there is no doubt about it, but there can be a lot of doubt about whether we are the kind of sheep that we ought to be. As we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday, let us pray to the Lord that we may be his good sheep, listening attentively to his voice, and follow his example of self-giving love.





GOSPEL: John 10:1-10

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what He meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again:

'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.' The Gospel of the Lord.
