Father's Message

In today's first reading we see the birth of the Church. It is a great place to look when we want to understand parish renewal.

- At Pentecost the disciples were all together in one room to pray. They did it regularly (Acts 1:14; 2:42 and other passages). Renewal starts from prayer, from union with God. That is why we started with Prayer Warriors for Renewal.
- 2. The Holy Spirit unites. He removed barriers (languages) and made them all one (the "body of Christ", second reading). People gathered around the disciples because they noticed something different. Once the Holy Spirit came upon them, they were attracted "at this sound". Our Community is rich in languages, cultures, races, age groups.
- Jesus sent them, like the Father sent him (Gospel passage).
 The Holy Spirit equipped them.
 Literally, Acts 2:4 says "the Spirit made them speak forth".
 He equipped them to witness, to "declare the wonders of God". The Church started her missionary work.

The Holy Spirit gives us a variety of gifts, each one with their own unique contribution to the Church and the world. He gives each one a "toolbox" suited to the plan of God for that person.

When you discover the gifts the Spirit gave you, you are a different person, like the Apostles, the disciples, the Saints.

Take steps to discover your toolbox!
