Father's Message

Life is filled with difficulties and challenges that make us afraid. Every day we are confronted by challenges: a new school, a new job, an operation, a strained relationship, etc. There are two types of fears; Healthy fear which protects us from harm and unhealthy fear paralyses me and we cannot do what is good for me and for others. We are at times controlled by unhealthy fears thus we cannot grow to its fulfilment. We want to do good and great things, and we are blocked by unhealthy fears.

Jesus wants me to be rid of my fears and anxiety through my personal relationship with Him. We are not left alone. We are under the loving eye of Jesus. St Jerome our Founder exhorted us to "remain with Christ". Jesus told us repeatedly "remain in me", "remain in my love". St John in his letter assures us that "love removes all fear" (1Jn4:18). Then I can share the Gospel in the daylight, I can proclaim the love of Jesus for me from the housetops. Then I can undertake what Jesus gives me to do, because I know he is with me. This is what he assured everyone he chose and sent out in the Scripture: "I will be with you."

We need to be witnesses to the world, declare ourselves for Jesus, in family, community, wherever we are. Evangelising is a daunting task, even in environments familiar to us, like our job place, our neighbourhood, even our families. Some of our community members, who trust in Jesus expressed the desire to reach out to others very lovingly and caringly to share their journey with Jesus with family members, colleagues, neighbours.

Prayer focus: Our personal relationship with Jesus delivers us from fear.

Action plan: Reach out to active Catholics in their immediate neighbourhood.
