Father's message

Do I know Jesus?

In this passage, the first question of Jesus is not personal. It is more akin to know the gossip of the town. Easily answered, and of little consequence.

The second is personal: "But you, who do you say I am?" (Matthew 16:15)

Jesus wants us to shift: from knowing about Jesus to knowing Jesus himself.

"Who do 'you' say that I am?" You. Not two centuries ago. Not even a hundred years ago. Not all the theologians and everybody else that we admire: St Augustine and St Thomas Aquinas and all these wonderful people.

In terms of my specific relationship with Jesus, it is my specific answer that matters.

Christ, Lord, Master, God, Redeemer, Saviour: what do these words mean personally to me? When I can answer, the consequence is astonishing: "On this rock I will build my church." (Matthew 16:18) On this faith, on this relationship.

"Whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven." (Matthew 16:19)

Prayer Focus: Our personal relationship with Jesus allows us to be his instruments. Action Plan: Find a quiet place, and answer honesty: "Who do you say I am?"

FROM THE INSTRUCTION "THE PASTORAL CONVERSION" The value of the Parish today

- 13. In order to promote the centrality of the missionary presence of the Christian community in the world, it is important not only to think about a new experience of Parish, but also about the ministry and mission of priests, who, together with the lay faithful, have the task of being "salt and light of the world" (cf. Mt 5:13-14), a "lamp on a lamp-stand" (cf. Mk 4:21), showing forth the face of an evangelising community, capable of an adequate reading of the signs of the times and of giving witness to coherent evangelical living.
- 14. Beginning with a consideration of the signs of the times, it is necessary, in listening to the Spirit, to produce new signs. With the Parish no longer being the primary gathering and social centre, as in former days, it is thus necessary to find new forms of accompaniment and closeness. A task of this kind ought not to be seen as a burden, but rather as a challenge to be embraced with enthusiasm.
- 15. Imitating their Master, the Lord's disciples, in the school of Saints and shepherds, learned, not without suffering, how to await the times and ways of God, thus nurturing the certainty that He is present until the end of time, and that the Holy Spirit the beating heart in the life of the Church– gathers together the children of God dispersed throughout the world. As a result, the Christian community should not be afraid to begin and accompany processes within territories that are host to diverse cultures, in the sure and certain hope that, for the disciples of Christ, "nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts".
