GOSPEL:

Matthew 20:1-16

Jesus said to His disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go to my vineyard too". In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first."

So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus, the last will be first and the first, last.

Father's message FORGIVING FROM THE HEART

"Seek the Lord while he is still to be found, call to him while he is still near. (Isaiah 55:6)

Emphasis is laid on the fact that we still have time. I might have failed many times to be faithful to the Lord. I might have turned away many times. As long as I am alive, I can get back on track - I better start now.

In the context of our parish renewal, I might have been reluctant to get involved. Perhaps I thought that I am already doing my bit, and I am comfortable to continue my way. Is what the Lord calls me to? Working together in the vineyard of the Lord, in a concerted effort, is much more effective than many people doing their good thing on their own. I still have time; I can start now.

"My friend, I am not being unjust to you [...]. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you." (Matthew 20:13-14)

"I will give you a fair wage." (Matthew 20:4) God's justice is different from ours. "Man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." (1Samuel 16:7) God, the righteous judge, has elements for his judgement that we do not know. Therefore, he judges differently.

We do experience the same, at times: we may be angry at a person's behaviour until we get a glimpse of their inward reasons - and then our anger evaporates, we are willing to let go, to forgive. We see the point.

If I happen to be among those who worked from the early hours, perhaps that is because God put me in a privileged condition, and I could see the goal right from the start. God knows that others may not have had the same favourable conditions, and he enabled me to be a beacon of light, a reminder, for them to get there in the end. Can I "grumble" after having been given a better start?

We are called to resemble God in ways of justice. God rejoices in the conversion of the sinner. "He makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. [...] Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5:45.48)

PARISH RENEWAL CORNER

FROM THE INSTRUCTION "THE PASTORAL CONVERSION" - Mission: the guiding principle for renewal

28. The various components that make up the Parish are called to communion and unity. When each part recognises its complementary role in service of the community, on the one hand, we see the fulfilment of the collaborative ministry of the Parish Priest with his Assistant Priests, while on the other hand, we see how the various charisms of deacons, consecrated men and women and the laity, cooperate in building up the singular body of Christ (cf. 1 Co 12:12).

29. The Parish is a community gathered together by the Holy Spirit to announce the Word of God and bring new children of God to birth in the baptismal font. Assembled by the pastor, the Parish celebrates the memorial of the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord, bearing witness to faith in charity, living in a permanent state of mission, whilst ensuring that no one is excluded from the salvific, life-giving message. Pope Francis expressed it thus: "The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community. While certainly not the only institution which evangelises, if the parish proves capable of self-renewal and constant adaptability, it continues to be "the Church living in the midst of the homes of her sons and daughters". This presumes that it really is in contact with the homes and the lives of its people and does not become a useless structure out of touch with people or a self-absorbed group made up of a chosen few. We must admit, though, that the call to review and renew our parishes has not yet sufficed to bring them nearer to people, to make them environments of living communion and participation, and to make them completely mission- oriented".


IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT - ST Jerome's Feast Day Celebration
