GOSPEL: *Matthew* 22:1-14

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests.

When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?"

And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'

Father's message

"For many are called, but few are chosen."

The wedding feast for the son reminds us of the Eucharist we celebrate every Sunday and of the eternal banquet, the eternal Eucharist we will enjoy in Heaven.

The people who were invited "did not want to come". Further down it is said that "they were not interested" (literally, the viewed the wedding feast as without significance, without perceived value). We may disapprove of the invitees who manhandled the servants.

However, our culture would approve of those who went about their business, who were not interested. "It is their choice, let them do what they want. Why should the king be offended at people who make their own choices?"

A look at the way weddings were conducted in Jesus' time tells us that celebrations lasted four or five days. No wonder people who have business priorities are reluctant to take part. And this was no ordinary wedding, it was the king's son. It might have lasted longer. Their choice showed their priorities: their business was more important to them, more significant, of higher perceived value.

The invitees proved not to be "worthy" (literally, they did not match the weight of the offer they were given. It is the same word used by Jesus when he said that those who love father and mother more than him are not worthy of him - they do not match the weight of his offer).

How could they match the weight? What did they have to do to be worthy?

Merely attending in a wedding garment. They had to prove they valued the offer by changing their priorities. they had to make time, to set other important things aside so as to give priority to the wedding feast.

The people called at the crossroads would not have had any time to prepare gifts or become worthy in any other way. They were both "evil and good people". No distinction is made at the moment of calling. They got dressed and showed up. They responded. They accepted the invitation and did what was needed at the moment: attended in a wedding garment. No deserving is needed. It is a parable about grace.

The distinction is made later: the wedding garment is needed. I might have been evil, but I can be made good. "Woman, where are they? Has anyone condemned you?" "No one, sir." "Neither do I condemn you. Go and sin no more."

Go and sin no more. I am given the wedding garment of forgiveness and redemption. I need to keep wearing it, to keep it on.

We are invited to the feast. Do we literally make time? Do we make time for God in our daily life? Do we make time regularly on a weekend for the Mass? Do we make time to deepen our relationship with Jesus?

We need to give priority to our relationship with Jesus. Revise our daily and weekly schedules to make our priorities ever clearer.

JEWISH WEDDINGS AT THE TIME OF JESUS

Once a future bride had been chosen for a young man, there followed a one-year period of betrothal. During this time the couple still lived apart. After the period of betrothal was finished and all the agreements had been reached, the wedding could take place. Weddings typically extended over a period of five to seven days. Autumn was the best time for marriage because the harvest was in, the vintage over, minds were free, and hearts were at rest. It was a season when the evenings were cool, and it was comfortable to sit up late at night. Usually the entire village gathered for a wedding.
