Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out.

The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made."

His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things; I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir", he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things; I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So, you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return, I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-fornothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."

Father's message

Mature disciples

A man "summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability." (Matthew 25:14-15)

The man did not give just a little: he gave "his property". The whole thing. God entrusts us with everythi His whole power is made available to us.

Let us do some maths again, to get the proportions of what Jesus meant.

1 talent (a weight of silver) = 6,000 denarii.

1 denarius = 1 day's wages. "He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into vineyard." (Matthew 20:2)

1 talent = 16.4 years of wages.

5 talents = 82.2 years of wages.

Jesus means that we received great and valuable gifts. God is not stingy. We have valuable gifts, given to by birth (natural talents) and from the Holy Spirit at Baptism and Confirmation (spiritual gi charisms).

We may not be aware of the gifts we carry, as is often the case. We may have a low opinion of ourselves compare ourselves to others who are impressive in our eyes. If we do not know the gifts we have, we can trade them. And we need to trade them: if we do not, we lose them. We cannot hope to just be left alone. 'carry precious gifts. And there are ways to discover them. **Called and Gifted** is a programme meant for t purpose. All who took it found it extremely affirming and empowering. It was a huge step towards **being mature disciples**. See the relevant notice in this newsletter.

I am given charisms - gifts - to be used for the work God gave us. Am I aware of them? Would I consider taking part in Called and Gifted, and discover my gifts?

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH TEACHING ON THE FINAL PURIFICATION, OR PURGATORY

1030 All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

1031 The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire: As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come.

1032 This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." From the beginning the Church has honoured the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead: Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them.
