Father's message

"Stay awake!" (Mark 13:33.35.37)

Jesus used this expression

- 3 times in these five verses
- 23 times in the New Testament
- including at his agony in the Getsemane.

It is obviously something Jesus really wants his disciples to learn.

Advent: a season of expectation - recalling the first coming of Jesus in Bethlehem, his second coming at the end of time, his coming at the end of our own life, his coming into my present circumstances.

We may wait in fear - which may stop us from living our life to the full.

We may wait in expectant delight - active, imaginative and creative.

"It is like a man travelling abroad." (Mark 13:34)

The image of a master who goes abroad is another common topic in the imagination of Jesus. He left us - me - in charge of his property.

The Master is not trying to catch us off guard: it is the nature of the journey, there is no clear return date. I do not want to miss the opportunity ("kairos").

"Stay awake!" The Lord is meeting us in our daily life - we do not want to miss Him.

Advent wreath, nativity scene, star outside our house - reminders to stay awake.

ADVENT

Advent has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight. Advent begins with First Vespers (Evening Prayer I) of the Sunday that falls on or closest to 30 November and it ends before First Vespers (Evening Prayer I) of Christmas. The Sundays of this time of year are named the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Sundays of Advent. The weekdays from 17 December up to and including 24 December are ordered in a more direct way to preparing for the Nativity of the Lord. (The Roman Missal)

Advent Wreath

The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent. The blessing may be celebrated during Mass, a celebration of the word of God, or Evening Prayer.

Customarily the Advent Wreath is constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which are inserted four candles. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent and the number of candles lighted each week corresponds to the number of the current week of Advent. The rose candle is lighted on the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday. (The Book of Blessings)
