FIRST READING: Isaiah 40:1-5.9-11

'Console my people, console them,' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for her crimes.'

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out His promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but He is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Luke 3:4, 6

Alleluia, Alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths; all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: *Mark* 1:1-8

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; He will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make His paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of His sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

Father's message

"The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God." (Mark 1:1)

All the readings today express the joy of a new development. Liberation from exile, a new, just and peaceful world, the coming of Jesus.

What would be good news to me? What is my deepest longing?

"I am going to send my messenger before you. (Mark 1:2)

I am the receiver of the messenger and the message, the Good News. How can I make sure others do not miss it? I am also a messenger to others, the bearer of this Good News.

How do I get ready for this mission?

"Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight." (Mark 1:3; Isaiah 40:3-4)

"My friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace." (2Peter 3:14)

I need to get ready, or I will miss it. I would not have eyes to see it, I would look without seeing, hear without grasping. In fact, John the Baptist preached "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." I need to get rid of spots and stains – I may miss the message; I may fail to pass it on.

What are my spots and stains?

People were "confessing their sins". Something we can do during Advent.

I need to take real steps to acknowledge my dark spots.

We will soon have our reconciliation. Whether here or elsewhere, we need it. If we do not take this step, we would not repent, we would miss the Good News. Joy will come, and we will miss it.

Laying mountains low, filling valleys: humbly making ourselves ready for Christ to be revealed to us, and through us.

To receive the Good News we are waiting for, and to share it, we need to get ready. "Live lives without spot or stain" - make use of Advent reconciliation opportunities.
