Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent.' #### **GOSPEL:** *Luke 1:26-38*

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me,' And the angel left her.

# Father's message

The readings of today challenge me to welcome the unpredictability of God's action. "Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? [...] The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a house." (2Samuel 7:5.11).

David is told to give up his plan and let God work - and conform to God's work. God's plan is suddenly sprung upon Mary, who cannot help being disturbed. "Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus." (Luke1:31)

Last week we heard how John came as a witness. We realised we are called to be witnesses, too: witnesses to Jesus. Before Mary could give Jesus to the world, she was asked to conceive him. Mary welcomed Jesus into her womb, into her being. The Gospel said that the angel "went in". This may be understood in two ways: he went into her house, or he went into her being. Jesus was formed in Mary for nine months, and then was out there. He was delivered to the world. He was offered, witnessed, shared. The life of Mary, like the life of every mother, must have been extensively rearranged, realigned, by the presence of the baby.

The same announcement Mary received is made to me: you are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. You are to welcome Jesus into your being, let him rearrange all your life, let him grow upon you, recognise him, learn to address him by name – Jesus. Eventually, very soon, you will be ready to witness, to share this presence. Mary was moved to do that very soon: she visited her cousin Elizabeth.

Am I ready for this major change? This is what we celebrate at Christmas. "Let what you have said be done to me." (Luke 1:38).

Let it happen. Surrender to God's work. Like Mary, we are to welcome Jesus into our being and let him realign our whole life. Welcome Jesus and look after his presence.

#### POPE FRANCIS ABOUT ST. JOSEPH IN HIS LETTER "PATRIS CORDE" WITH A FATHER'S HEART:

that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as "the son of Joseph". Matthew and Luke, the two Evangelists who speak most of Joseph, tell us very little, yet enough for us to appreciate what sort of father he was, and the mission entrusted to him by God's providence.

We know that Joseph was a lowly carpenter (cf. Mt 13:55), betrothed to Mary (cf. Mt 1:18; Lk 1:27). He was a "just man" (Mt 1:19), ever ready to carry out God's will as revealed to him in the Law (cf. Lk 2:22.27.39) and through four dreams (cf. Mt 1:20; 2:13.19.22). After a long and tiring journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, he beheld the birth of the Messiah in a stable, since "there was no place for them" elsewhere (cf. Lk 2:7). He witnessed the adoration of the shepherds (cf. Lk 2:8-20) and the Magi (cf. Mt 2:1-12), who represented respectively the people of Israel and the pagan peoples.

Joseph had the courage to become the legal father of Jesus, to whom he gave the name revealed by the angel: "You shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Mt 1:21). As we know, for ancient peoples, to give a name to a person or to a thing, as Adam did in the account in the Book of Genesis (cf. 2:19-20), was to establish a relationship.

In the Temple, forty days after Jesus' birth, Joseph and Mary offered their child to the Lord and listened with amazement to Simeon's prophecy concerning Jesus and his Mother (cf. Lk 2:22-35). To protect Jesus from Herod, Joseph dwelt as a foreigner in Egypt (cf. Mt 2:13-18). After returning to his own country, he led a hidden life in the tiny and obscure village of Nazareth in Galilee, far from Bethlehem, his ancestral town, and from Jerusalem and the Temple. Of Nazareth it was said, "No prophet is to rise" (cf. Jn 7:52) and indeed, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (cf. Jn 1:46). When, during a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, Joseph and Mary lost track of the twelve-year-old Jesus, they anxiously sought him out and they found him in the Temple, in discussion with the doctors of the Law (cf. Lk 2:41-50).

After Mary, the Mother of God, no saint is mentioned more frequently in the papal magisterium than Joseph, her spouse. My Predecessors reflected on the message contained in the limited information handed down by the Gospels in order to appreciate more fully his central role in the history of salvation. Blessed Pius IX declared him "Patron of the Catholic Church", Venerable Pius XII proposed him as "Patron of Workers" and Saint John Paul II as "Guardian of the Redeemer". Saint Joseph is universally invoked as the "patron of a happy death".


