GOSPEL:

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new,' they said 'and with authority behind it: He gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey Him.' And His reputation rapidly spread everywhere through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

Father's message

Jesus teaches "with authority".

"His teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority." (Mark 1:22)

"Here is a teaching that is new and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him." (Mark 1:27)

Authority: power to act - a person comes into their own jurisdiction and so can make things happen.

Genesis 1:3: "God said, "Let there be light," and there was light." In God there is no separation between word and action, intention, and action.

People were impressed by the fact that Jesus did not merely speak - his teaching made things happen: "he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him." (Mark 1:27)

Should I desire the same authority as Jesus - dream that my preaching, my teaching bear the same results? It is a common temptation - to want control over people, to manipulate their choices according to what we think is best. It was the temptation of Simon the sorcerer in Acts 8. Rather, my ministry should help people to see that **Jesus retains the same authority, the same power to act. Jesus' words still do what they are meant to do.** How can I show the authority of Jesus?

"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

Paul repeatedly recalled his past as a persecutor of the Church, and his weaknesses and limitations. People also saw the power of Jesus had changed him and worked in him, and they believed.

He asked them to be his imitators - he, weak and frail, who surrendered to the power of Jesus, and was transformed.

My weakness can prove Jesus' authority and power.

It is in my weakness, not in my smartness, that I experience and manifest the power of Jesus. Surrender to Jesus: call my weakness by name and let Jesus work.

SYNAGOGUE
