FIRST READING: Ezekiel 2:2-5

The spirit came into me and made me stand up, and I heard the Lord speaking to me. He said, 'Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, to the rebels who have turned against Me. Till now they and their ancestors have been in revolt against Me. The sons are defiant and obstinate; I am sending you to them, to say, "The Lord says this." Whether they listen or not, this set of rebels shall know there is a prophet among them.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 122: R. v. 2

R: Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy.

To You I have lifted up my eyes, You who dwell in the heavens: my eyes, like the eyes of slaves on the hands of their lords. **R**

Like the eyes of a servant on the hand of her mistress, so our eyes are on the Lord our God till He shows us His mercy. **R**

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

In view of the extraordinary nature of these revelations, to stop me from getting too proud I was given a thorn in the flesh, an angel of Satan to beat me and stop me from getting too proud! About this thing, I have pleaded with the Lord three times for it to leave me, but He has said, 'My grace is enough for you: My power is at its best in weakness.' So, I shall be very happy to make my weaknesses my special boast so that the power of Christ may stay over me, and that is why I am quite content with my weaknesses, and with insults, hardships, persecutions, and the agonies I go through for Christ's sake. For it is when I am weak that I am strong.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Luke 4:18

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me:

He sent me to bring Good News to the poor. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: *Mark* 6:1-6

Jesus went to His hometown and His disciples accompanied Him. With the coming of the Sabbath, He began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard Him. MESSAGE –14th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME. Do I take people, and Jesus, for granted?

Jesus went to his hometown. (Mark 6:1)

I clearly recall a number of priests in the community of my religious Order who were greatly appreciated by outsiders, and yet they were not as valued within the Order.

Like everyone else, they had their weaknesses, too. People in general appreciated their strengths. Those who were familiar with them were rather inclined to look at the shadows - and largely missed the gifts they were bearing. I myself was not innocent of this mistake.

Perhaps this is part of what is at work in this event of Jesus' life.

The people of Nazareth were very familiar with him - and missed the gift he was bearing.

Are we missing the gift that anyone is bearing in our life, because we are too familiar with them? Are we missing what Jesus has to offer us through that person or experience?

Do I take anyone for granted?

Am I missing a gift Jesus is offering me?

This week, let us give a second thought to what happens to us, like Mary.

We do not want to miss out.

AGENDA PUBLISHED FOR PLENARY COUNCIL

The Council agenda was published on June 18. It will shape the program of the Council's assemblies – the first of which opens on October 3 this year.

The agenda has been developed in the form of posing questions, with 16 questions falling under six themes: Conversion; Prayer; Formation; Structures; Governance; and Institutions.

"The agenda asks us a number of difficult questions, but without asking those difficult questions, we won't be entering into the depth of our hearts to consider how we become that missionary, Christ-centred Church we need today." (Archbishop Costelloe, president of the Council).

PASTORAL LETTER OF ARCHBISHOP TIMOTHY ON VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING

Here is the beginning of the letter, which can be found under "Archbishop's latest" at perthcatholic.org.au.

On Thursday, 1 July 2021, legislation passed by the Western Australian State Parliament in relation to "Voluntary Assisted Dying" (VAD) will be enacted. Put simply this legislation will permit a person, under certain specified conditions, to access medication which is designed to cause that person's death. The legislation will also permit other people, again under certain specified conditions, to provide assistance to those who without such assistance would be unable to administer the medication to themselves.

At this important time for our society, and for the Catholic community which seeks to be a vibrant and engaged part of the wider community, I have decided to share with you some perspectives which I hope will help you to reflect on the significance of this moment.
