#### FIRST READING:

# Exodus 16:2-4.12-15

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our heart's content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them in this way to see whether they will follow My law or not.'

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning, you shall have bread to your heart's content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God".' And so, it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That,' said Moses to them, 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

### **GOSPEL:**

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor His disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found Him on the other side, they said to Him, 'Rabbi, when did You come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for Me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.

# MESSAGE –18th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

"I am the bread of life." (John 6:35)

Jesus does not disregard our needs.

He knows that our immediate needs are the place where we can first experience his power and believe in him.

And he knows that all the good things that give us pleasure in this life are temporary. They satisfy us for a little while, and then we hunger for something else. We are made for an infinite love, an infinite fulfilment, which God alone can provide.

## "Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life." (John 6:27) 'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' (John 6:34)

We do want a solution for all needs, the satisfaction of all cravings. We do long for that peace where we do not crave any more, because we found fulfilment. Yet, we look for it in the wrong places. We can see how hard it is to shift from the things we love or need to God, the provider of them all.

St. Augustine, Confessions, book 10: "Late have I loved You, O Beauty, so ancient, and yet so new! Late have I loved You! For behold, You were within, and I without, and there did I seek You; I, unlovely, rushed heedlessly among the things of beauty You made." "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst." (John 6:35)

Jesus gently leads me to shift my attention from the bread that feeds my tummy to Himself, who alone can satisfy all my longings.

# PASTORAL LETTER OF ARCHBISHOP TIMOTHY ON VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING

Here is the beginning of the letter, which can be found under "Archbishop's latest" at **perthcatholic.org.au.** 

On Thursday, 1 July 2021, legislation passed by the Western Australian State Parliament in relation to "Voluntary Assisted Dying" (VAD) will be enacted. Put simply this legislation will permit a person, under certain specified conditions, to access medication which is designed to cause that person's death. The legislation will also permit other people, again under certain specified conditions, to provide assistance to those who without such assistance would be unable to administer the medication to themselves.

At this important time for our society, and for the Catholic community which seeks to be a vibrant and engaged part of the wider community, I have decided to share with you some perspectives which I hope will help you to reflect on the significance of this moment.

# SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY AND STATEMENT 2021-2022

We celebrate Social Justice Sunday on the 29th of August. The Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement, Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor, invites us to join in responding to Pope Francis' invitation to take a seven-year journey towards total ecological sustainability guided by seven Laudato Si' Goals.

The Statement provides theological foundations to ground and inspire our efforts to care for creation while responding to the needs of the disadvantaged and excluded.

# AGENDA PUBLISHED FOR PLENARY COUNCIL

The Council agenda was published on June 18. It will shape the program of the Council's assemblies – the first of which opens on October 3 this year.

The agenda has been developed in the form of posing questions, with 16 questions falling under six themes: Conversion; Prayer; Formation; Structures; Governance; and Institutions.

"The agenda asks us a number of difficult questions, but without asking those difficult questions, we won't be entering into the depth of our hearts to consider how we become that missionary, Christ-centred Church we need today." (Archbishop Costelloe, president of the Council).
